Instead of going into the needs for the weekend (and there are many) I thought I would share some of the nuggets that God has been revealing to me as I travel this road of adventure(a). As many of you know I have worked in the quality field for many years now. One of the tools we use to get the root of a problem is called the 5-why analysis. The approach which can be used in any area of life is this: if you continue to ask the question why you will get to the core reason or source of the problem. Depending on the depth of the problem you may not need to ask 5 times to get to the source but usually by 5 you can find the source of any situation.

God brought this to mind during my quiet time a while back as I was thinking about why we serve on team. The why flow may go something like this:

Why are you serving on team? I felt God was calling me to serve

Why was God calling you to serve? There is someone He wants to touch through me

Why does God want to touch someone? Because this will bring them closer to Him

Why do they need to be closer to God? As they draw closer to the heart of God, they reflect Him more clearly and He is glorified all the more.
