It's hard to believe the weekend is over. All those months of preparation and it's done in 2 days. I accepted the position of Coordinator and before I knew it the team meeting process was beginning and then I blinked my eyes and the weekend was upon us. Even though my perception of the journey seemed short there was plenty that happened during that time. The make up of the team was not finalized until just before the weekend. Our chief faced health issues that caused her to have to drop off the team just prior to the weekend. This and many other "challenges" were faced along the way. In and through it all, our God was absolutely faithful. I was blown away by the flexibility of the team and their willingness to step up to the plate and do what needed to be done without reservation. God provided for us every step of the way. As I reflect upon this journey I am reminded of one of the wonderful ways that God works in these types of experiences: When brothers and sisters in Christ work side by side to accomplish the purposes of God there is a level of closeness that is not often experienced any other way. We are also drawn closer to God as well.

By the time the weekend arrived I felt like I was on auto-pilot (or should I say God-pilot) as I watched God do amazingly more that we could have asked or imagined (Eph 3:20). I watched as the guests who started out the weekend with "fear and trembling" turned into sheep in the arms of their master as He carried them to the flock. Not being at a specific table for the weekend allowed me the privilege of being able to see the work that God was doing at **each** table. I watched as relationships began and blossomed as the weekend progressed. I saw the shy and reserved open up like blooming flowers. I watched as tears flowed and healing began, as God moved and lives were changed. There was not a moment on that weekend where God was not present. He met us at every turn. I had a front row seat as God transformed lives right in front of me.

Since the weekend I have been asking God, as I often do, is there a life lesson in this? How should the experience of these weekends affect the way we live outside of the weekend? Is it possible to walk everyday with an awareness of God's presence and an intimacy similar to that which we experience prior to and during the Aventura weekend? And is it possible to see God move as powerfully in the lives of those we know and love like we experience on these weekends? God knows there is a world of hurting people out there who could use a touch of His spirit. I believe the answer lies in our relationship with God through His Son Jesus. How hungry are we for Him? Does He have top priority in our lives? The Psalmist says it well in Psalm 42:1, "As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for you, my God." Can we relate to that verse? Is He the desire of our hearts? If He is truly our hearts desire and we avoid letting worldly temptations crowd Him out of our lives, we will walk in His spirit and know the intimacy that Jesus had with His Father when He walked this earth. And then we can know that He will use us to accomplish His wonderful purposes not only in our lives but in the lives of those around us. In all of this He is glorified.
